## Eight percent increase in general security announced allocation.

The NSW Department of Primary Industries (DPI) this morning announced an eight percent increase in the general security allocation, taking the announced allocation to a total of 28 percent in the NSW Murray.

As a result of this increase Murray Irrigation's announced allocation is now 28 percent for general security (Class C) entitlement customers.

DPI confirmed trade restrictions across the Barmah Choke remain relaxed, with the relaxation reviewed monthly.

Trade out of the Murrumbidgee Valley is at its limit and remains closed, while trade to and from the Lower Darling is also closed because of storage levels in the Menindee Lakes.

The following chances of improvements were released based on all years of inflow records:
