# Managing risk on-farm

Farming is recognised as one of the most dangerous occupations in Australia. Most farm-related accidents are preventable.

Machinery, vehicles and power are all obvious risks, but animals, noise and weather are other risks that should be managed. Suggestions for making your farm safer include regularly walking around the farm to assess potential dangers and devise ways to improve safety.

# Water Exchange to close Friday

The Murray Water Exchange will close at **5.00pm this Friday 3 June**. All transactions need to be completed by this deadline. Unsold allocation and delivery entitlements will be returned to the seller, while funds from unsuccessful buyer bids will be returned to the buyer.

Customers should review water allocation accounts to ensure they do not have greater than 50 percent of water entitlements remaining as volume on their account and that water usage will not exceed 120 percent of annual delivery entitlements. Water can be sold or purchased and annual delivery entitlements traded up until the close of the Water Exchange on Friday 3 June.

Internal annual transfers close at **5.00pm Friday 10 June**, to allow balancing of water allocation accounts for volume and annual delivery entitlements prior to the close of season. For more information, contact reception on T. 1300 138 265.
